

Yardage Cutting Yield Chart

How to use this chart:

This chart tells how many pieces (strips) of a certain size can be cut from a width of fabric.

The far left column is the width of the fabric.

The top row is the width of the strip or piece you are cutting.

The intersection of the rows and columns shows how many pieces of the desired size can be cut from a specific width.

For example:

Let's say that you have a piece of fabric that is 26" wide
(perhaps you've already cut your borders parallel to the selvedge, leave the fabric 26" wide).

How many 2.5" squares can you get from one strip of 26"?

You would first find the 26" row in the column on the right.

Then follow the row over until you get to the 2.5" column.

Therefore, you would be able to get 10 - 2.5" squares from a 26"-wide piece of fabric.
